Building Department:

Building permits must be obtained prior to the beginning of any construction. Permits are required for new structures, additions, sleeping and guest cabins, chimneys, wood stoves, fireplaces, accessory buildings, structural foundations, docks, storage buildings, decks, and porches. Approval from other agencies may be required before a building permit can be issued. Other agencies may include the North Bay Mattawa Conservation Authority, Ministry of Transportation, Ministry of Environment and Climate Change, Hydro One, Ministry of Natural Resources and Forestry, and Department of Fisheries and Oceans.



DOCKS – Planning on replacing your dock or installing a new one? You require a building permit from the Township.

OPEN PERMITS – If you

have an open permit, please contact the Building Department to review the necessary steps to close off your project.

INSPECTIONS – Remember, it is the property owner or their agent's responsibility to notify the building department at the various stages which require inspection, as outlined in the building permit.

SHIPPING CONTAINERS - Shipping containers are considered a building under the Building Code Act and therefore require a building permit to install.

Here are the highlights of our past year:

- WATERFRONT we distributed Lake Protection Workbooks and Septic Smart booklet to all households
- FISHING we created a sign detailing best practices for catch-and-release fishing and posted it at boat launches
- WATER QUALITY MONITORING was continued in conjunction with MLCA
- A report on the history of monitoring WATER LEVELS on Lake Manitouwabing was posted
- **INVASIVE SPECIES** signs were posted and sampling conduction through FOCA in conjunction with MLCA (results on the web page)

COMING IN 2023

- Four demonstration POLLINATOR PATCHES will be planted on township property
- Water quality monitoring will continue and be upgraded to regularly include phosphorus and calcium in cooperation with MLCA on six township lakes
- Guidelines for maintaining lake water quality by maintaining and restoring SHORELINE **VEGETATION** are being developed
- Working with MLCA and an Ontario researcher on a study on **BOAT WAKES** on Lake Manitouwabing
- The CLEAN UP OUR LAKES program will return for a month at the end of April at the transfer station
