Building Department:

Building permits must be obtained prior to the beginning of any construction. Permits are required for new structures, additions, sleeping and guest cabins, chimneys, wood stoves, fireplaces, accessory buildings, structural foundations, docks, storage buildings, decks, and porches. Applications are available on the Township website at:

Approval from other agencies may be required before a building permit can be issued. Other agencies may include North Bay Mattawa Conservation Authority, Ministry of Transportation, Ministry of Environment and Climate Change, Hydro One, Ministry of Natural Resources and Forestry, Department of Fisheries and Oceans.



DOCKS – Planning on replacing your dock or installing a new one? You require a building permit from the Township.

OPEN PERMITS – If you have an open permit, please contact the Building Department to review the necessary steps to close off your project.

INSPECTIONS – Remember, it is the property owner or their agent's responsibility to notify the building department at the various stages which require inspection, as outlined in the building permit.

SHIPPING CONTAINERS - Shipping containers are considered a building under the Building Code Act and therefore require a building permit to install.

AERODROMES and **DRONES**

Aerodromes include airports, heliports, seaplane/ski-plane bases, or anywhere that an aircraft can take off and land. It is a Federal Offence to fly a recreational drone within three nautical miles of an aerodrome.

Most of the Township of McKellar and a portion of the Municipality of McDougall are federally designated as an Aerodrome and are therefore considered a "No Fly Zone" for Drones. You could face serious penalties and/or jail time, if you break the rules, including:

- Up to \$1,000 for flying without a drone pilot certificate.
- Up to \$1,000 for flying unregistered or unmarked drones.
- Up to \$1,000 for flying where you are not allowed.
- Up to \$3,000 for putting aircraft and people at risk.

Transport Canada say anyone who sees someone flying a drone

illegally should call 911.For more information on flying a drone safely and

Lake Stewardship and Environmental Committee

The Lake Stewardship and Environmental Committee of McKellar Township was changed by Council from an ad hoc committee to a standing committee in the fall of 2021. We have met monthly. The meetings are either hybrid or exclusively on zoom. The public is welcome to attend.

We are examining the work that needs to be done to protect the lakes and lands of the township. In the three years that the ad hoc committee met, they developed a final report which included four broad goals to guide the future work of the committee:

- The Lake Stewardship and Environmental Committee will advocate for clean water and healthy lakes in the Township by regularly assessing water quality in conjunction with the Manitouwabing Lake Community Association, the Public Health Unit, the Lake Partner Program, and the Georgian Bay Biosphere through assessment of indicators of potential contamination and providing educational suggestions about the factors which promote clean water and the beauty of our environment.
- 2. The Lake Stewardship and Environmental Committee will promote and maintain a healthy wildlife habitat, on land and in the water, by assessing factors which cause pollution, educating the McKellar township residents about those factors and making recommendations to Council concerning Bylaw changes or other actions to be taken.
- 3. The Lake Stewardship and Environmental Committee will promote environmental responsibility in all recreational activities on our lakes.
- 4. The Lake Stewardship and Environmental Committee will continue to work with the Georgian Bay Biosphere (GBB) to combat climate change and reduce our carbon footprint to improve the health of our citizens, the lakes and environment.

Since the fall, we have made progress on a number of issues. We have received a preliminary report on the lake capacity study completed by Chelsea Crundwell and Carl Mitchell from U of T.

- We received a presentation on Work Permits, Boat Houses and the Public Lands Act by S/Sgt Robert Gibson of the MNRF. We have designed and received the delivery of signs promoting catch and release fishing which will be posted in the summer. The MNRF requested assistance in monitoring the catches in Armstrong Lake, which they have stocked twice; so, two additional signs were made to assist fishers in anonymous reporting.
- We have researched and purchased educational information on lake protection that we will give to township residents this summer with a view to nutrient level of the lakes and the biodiversity of the flora and fauna in the lakes.
- We have also researched information on septic system management, and will have that available.

Other areas of activity include:

- reviewing a food cycler program for food waste at council's request
- reviewing the Georgian Bay Biosphere's ICECAP program to decrease carbon emissions
- studying the history of control of the water level management in Lake Manitouwabing.

OPP ONLINE REPORTING PROGRAM

This program allows you to submit a report to the OPP from computer or mobile device. All submissions will be sent directly to OPP and reviewed by officer. Use this system to report lost/missing property under \$5000.00, stolen license plates or validation stickers, theft from a vehicle under \$5000.00, mischief to a vehicle under \$5000.00, damage to property under \$5000.00, thefts under \$5000.00 and driving complaints. DID YOU KNOW.....

Modified snowmobile mufflers are a concern for the police. Much of Ontario's trail system encompasses private property. The private land owners allow the use of their land for snowmobile use via Ontario Federation of Snowmobile Clubs (OFSC) trails. BUT, landowners and municipalities are being disturbed by the increase in snowmobile exhaust noise, which is resulting in trail closures. Under the Motorized Snow Vehicle Act, section 18.2, there are applicable charges for modifying, altering or changing the exhaust or muffler on your snowmobile.
